TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

Because of the special nature of Bali's culture and spiritual vitality, the following is asked of you if you join us on this tour:

1. Regarding attire - Please respect their request for proper temple attire (sarong, waist tie, and blouses that cover the arm pits) when going to temple. On the streets western dress (shorts, pants, dresses, singlets etc) is accepted unless it is provocative. Outside of temple, no one will say anything but your experience will be rendered shallow if you are dressed risqué. If you have an open wound or are menstruating, please do not enter temples.

2. Please refrain from overindulgence of alcohol, and late night bar scenes.
3. While the local men may offer their sexual services, at a fee, please forgo the pleasure.
4. It is considered impolite to point your finger or your toes at anyone. It is not acceptable to touch the top of a child's head (thus blocking the free movement of the soul.)
5. Tipping, at restaurants and spas, are not expected but, if you tip, remember that all tips go to the owner if made in public, that all tips cause jealousy, confusion, and resentment unless done in secret, as in a handshake. \$3 a day is the usual average wages of a working man or woman. Respect the economy and tip accordingly if you are private about it. Begging is NOT a Balinese custom and is purely a revenue-endeavor for people who come to Bali for that purpose. Begging does tremendous damage to the local economy by sending the wrong message.
6. When shopping. Unless marked as "fixed price" it is assumed you will join the shop owners in the pleasures of bargaining...usually begin at 1/3 of the asking price and settle at half. If you do not want to negotiate , ask them for "lowest price". Paying "lowest price" is acceptable but is a disappointment to the shop keeper as such ways of getting to know visitors (bargaining) is why they are in business.
